- June started with the ASHE National Conference which was held in Williamsburg, VA.
- July had the rededication of the Pinchot Monument on July 21, 2006 in conjunction with PennDOT. This event included plenty of press and many distinguished speakers to commemorate the 75th anniversary of the Pinchot Road legislation. This was quite a memorable event and an honor for ASHE to be able to restore a part of transportation history!
- In August we had our 8th Annual Golf Outing and as always, a great time was had by all. It was a huge success which earned our scholarship fund over \$8,000.
- In September we joined PSPE and ASCE for our annual joint picnic and casino night.
- October was the second year for tours of the Susquehanna River Bridge. It was a great way to see first hand the work they were completing. Also in October we hosted the first of two Younger Member Happy Hours which we hold throughout the year in hopes of recruiting new members.
- Beginning in November with Dave Zangrilli as our speaker, we started our monthly dinner meetings. In the following months the speakers were Carlos Rosenberger, Deputy Secretary Rick Hogg, Chester Allen, James Cheatham with FHWA and concluded with our very own John Becker. Whether the presentations were untying the knots on a project, asphalt, roadway and bridge needs, CEU requirements, SAFETEA-LU programs, or concrete, they all were informative and enjoyable. We also held the first of two Adopt-A-Highway litter pickups for our interchange area/section of I-83.
- January brought the announcement of our Annual Photo Contest. We had 13 photos submitted last year.
- February included our celebration of Engineer's Week at the Central Pennsylvania Engineer's Week Council banquet on February 22 where our nomination of "Engineer of the Year", Gary Hoffman was honored. We also participated with an ASHE display at the Colonial Park Mall. The Patriot-News Science Fair also took place at Dickinson College where ASHE members helped judge the entries, and awards were presented on behalf of ASHE for the outstanding engineering projects. Also in February, ASHE was involved in the 1st Annual CANstruction Design/Build Competition in Central Pa where our "Apple iPod Cano" received "Honorable Mention". All money and canned goods benefited the food banks of Central Pennsylvania. Giant Foods donated the first 1,500 cans and through donations from our sponsors, we were able to donate \$2,400 to this great cause.
- April had the 3rd Annual ASHE Harrisburg/PennDOT District 8-0 Conference being held on April 5 with over 220 attendees including 40 PennDOT personnel. Gerald M. Kuncio, M.A.

**American History, Project Manager,

Project Keystone: Stone Arch Bridge Management Study

Gerald M. Kuncio is a Historian with the Monroeville office of Skelly and Loy, Inc., an environmental and engineering firm headquartered in Harrisburg. He is an expert in the research and documentation of historic bridges, bridge fabrication companies, and the bridge construction process. Currently, Mr. Kuncio is Skelly and Loy's project manager on Project Keystone, PennDOT's plan to preserve and maintain stone arch bridges in the Philadelphia region. Project Keystone has two major components, a Management Plan that ranks 125 stone arch bridges in PennDOT District 6-0 according to their preservation potential, and a Maintenance Manual that provides guidance of maintaining, preserving, and repairing stone bridges while respecting their historic character. Other projects for Skelly and Loy include historic bridge recordations in Pennsylvania, West Virginia, and New York, the development of historic bridge websites and driving brochures, and creating wayside exhibit panels for bridges. Prior to joining Skelly and Loy, Mr. Kuncio was the Principal Historian for the Western Pennsylvania portion of PennDOT's comprehensive survey of highway bridges constructed prior to 1957. As part of that study, Mr. Kuncio examined bridge records for approximately 12,000 bridges, and field surveyed more than 1,300 in a 33 county area. He has also served as an on-air commentator on the History Channel's™ popular program, *Modern Marvels*, where he spoke on the bridges of Pittsburgh.

Mr. Kuncio holds a B.A. in American History from Duquesne University and an M.A., also in American History, from the University of Delaware.
